It's a naked streetbike named the G 310 R, with a single-cylinder engine displacing 313cc. The new TVS-BMW has

been designed and engineered in Munich, Germany, to be produced at TVS' state-of-the-art Hosur factory outside Bengaluru, adhering to stringent BMW standards. No word, whether it will come to the U.S.
