The 1980 Kawasaki Z1000 Classic was the first production bike with electronic fuel injection. The system was manufactured for Kawasaki by *Japan Precision Electronics*, which had the rights to produce the *Bosch Jetronic* system specifically for motorcycles. In actual fact it was identical in concept and design to the Bosch fuel-injection that was being used on Datsun (Nissan) cars at the time. Ironically, almost 3 years before Bosch introduced fuel injection together with BMW on the K100. By now, "setting the float height" is almost a lost art...(you could also call it a "pain in the neck").

Well, the carbs are done now, and when we return from a trip - we really had not planned - I will check the valves and get the old lady running. You may see her a little more often than in previous years.

Until then, ride safe, if you get out early. Remember, you want to get used to it again....
